

Att endance is int egral for learning: being in school allows children to flourish, academically and emot ionally, giving them the confidence to learn from their mist akes. They build friendship groups that can last a lif et ime because educat ion has given them the tools they need to grow.

Wit hout that regular time in school, pupils soon miss out on vit al learning, they miss out on group act ivit ies, they miss out on chat s and playing.

Those first days back really matter. Evidence from a recent Children's commissioner report showed that children who miss days 2,3 and 4 of the new term for unaut horised reasons had a predict ed overall absence of almost $45 \%$, or 31 days across the term.

Being regularly late can also have an impact on young lives; it causes anxiet y when a child has to enter a classroom or assembly hall and others turn to look, they don't know what to expect: it causes the t eacher to st op the lesson, having to explain again for the lat e pupil, causing the ot her pupils to miss out on their learning too.

This academic year the impact of pupils being late to school alone has generat ed over 64,000 minut es of lost learning; holidays have caused over 22,000 hours of lost learning.

From Sept ember 2023 , if your child is late 10 times in 1 term (or 2 subsequent half terms), you will receive an awareness letter from us. After another 10 lates, you will receive a warning letter from us - if any of those late marks are after the register has closed ( 9.25 am ) this generates a 'U' mark, once your child has 10 U marks, they will receive a warning letter from the Local Authority Attendance Team which will go on your child's

## Holidays in term time

We understand that life is unpredictable and emergencies happen, but over the last academic year, over 109 holidays were taken this year causing over 2,405 hours of lost learning. If you take your child on holiday without letting us know, we will continue to try to contact you and should we not hear from you, we will make a home visit as we have a legal responsibility to safeguard your child.

Government Regulations state that there is no entitlement for parents to withdraw their children for authorised leave of absence in term time. Head teachers can only grant leave of absence during term-time if there are 'exceptional circumstances' surrounding the request and parents have made an application in advance.

Definition of exceptional is: 'rare, significant, unavoidable and short', with 'unavoidable' meaning an event that could not reasonably be scheduled at another time.

Taking leave of absence in term time does affect child's educational progress, and parents are strongly discouraged from withdrawing their child from school during term time.

All applications for leave of absence must be made in advance to school. Request forms are available at the school office.

Any period of leave taken without the agreement of the school, or in excess of the agreed number of days, will be classed as unauthorised absence, and may result in the issue of Education Penalty Notices by the Local Authority
