

UNICEF's Rights Respecting Schools Program



At the heart of our school's ethos and behaviour systems is our commitment to promoting children's rights. We make sure that children understand their rights in the context of our school, in their communities as well as national and global issues. We have received UNICEF's Recognition of Commitment (ROC) and are working towards our Level 1 award.

Our children understand that with rights we must respect the rights of others. Practically this means that if we understand that we have the right to be safe, learn, respected and happy; we must respect others to ensure they get their right to be safe, learn, respected and happy too.

At the start of each academic year every class decides which three rights they want their class to focus. For example:

Every month we focus on a different right. UNICEF Rights Group (URG) decide the focused right and announce it to the whole school at the first Celebration Assembly of every month. To motivate and develop the pupils' understanding further, there is a monthly competition, for example, to make a poster or poem on the focused right.
